Composition (30%) course work

One Brief composition which assesses technique – either Bach Chorale, 2-part counterpoint, Arranging or Remix

Once recital (performed in front of an audience) lasting a minimum of 8 minutes

Transition Work for A level Music

Obviously keep practicing/involving yourself in performing wherever possible

Composition:

Write a theme and variation with a difference!

- 1) Choose a well-known melody this could be a Christmas carol or a nursery rhyme.
- 2) Explore 3 different ways of varying this however;
 - a) One must explore they manipulation of texture.
 - b) One must explore harmony
 - c) One must include a fusion of some sort

You can also manipulate within these movements in any way that you want.

Tips

- Try to avoid being formulaic, Don't just explore <u>one</u> texture. Try and see how you can incorporate different textures within the same movement
- Think carefully about your use of harmony explore alternative chords within the diatonic series; consider using extended chords; consider inversions.

You are going to have to extend the structure within each 'movement' Do not presume that you will be able to manipulate this enough by sticking to the original length so be creative.

Appraisal

Choose a piece of music which relates to either (do not choose one from the set work list) Film music, Instrumental music

It can be by any composer. For each create a spider diagram/mind map which explores the following elements of music:

Instrumentation

Texture

Tonality

Tempo

Dynamics

Consider changes in all these areas and consider the impact that this has on the piece
