- In 2019, 100% of the 524 A Level entries achieved A*-E grades, with almost 30% of entries being awarded the highest grades of A*-A.
- Our average pass rates over the past five years have been 99.54% (A*-E) and 62% achieving A*-B grades.
 Our average point score in 2018 was the highest in Calderdale, along with a student completion rate of 98.7%.
- Our motto is Living to Learn, Learning to Live. We develop the whole person, both academically and through personal enrichment. We provide a wide range of courses, opportunities, activities and experiences to promote confidence, independence and build fantastic personal statements and CVs.

- Since 2015 we have spent £7.5 million on refurbishments across the school including a new £3 million sports hall and fitness suite, which was opened in 2017.



SIXTH FORM LEARNING CENTRE



The Sixth Form Learning Centre is in the centre of the school's grounds and is home to the Sixth Form Office, classrooms for specialist A Level subjects, plus the Sixth Form Diner and Sixth Form Common Room which make up the social hub of the centre.

Adjacent to the Sixth Form Learning Centre is an independent study area, solely for Year 12 and Year 13 students, which has workstations, study booths and ICT access. Students also have access to the school's Learning Resource Centre and the Careers Library.

Sixth Form students also have access to the fitness suite in the Sports Hall.

INDUCTION

We take the pastoral care of our students very seriously, and we feel that it is important that all our Year 12 students make a smooth transition into life as members of the NHGS Sixth Form. That is why we have a carefully planned induction programme to help students with this settling in process.

Before the summer, students who are new to NHGS are invited to an informal afternoon to meet their form tutor and other students.

During the first few weeks of the academic year, all Sixth Form students take part in our Induction Day which combines team building activities and a social lunch. Weather permiting, activities take place outside, making full use of our outdoor space and stunning surroundings.

The programme of activity is designed to encourage students to get to know their tutor group and form tutor. We aim to ensure that all students have a network of friends and teachers to support them during their time at NHGS.

The first few PSCHEE lessons are focused on developing good independent study skills to enable students to make a smooth transition into A Level study.

NHGS has worked with Carnegie Centre of Excellence for Mental Health in Schools (at Leeds Beckett University) and we were delighted to have been awarded the Bronze status in recognition of our outstanding well-being provision within the school.

This is the highest possible award for in-school well-being provisions, as the silver and gold awards are awarded when a school shares good practice with other schools, across trusts, or on a national scale.

We are 1 of only 4 schools to have been awarded this.

CAREERS & ENTERPRISE

In Year 12, students take part in numerous careers and enterprise activities and are presented with information on the full range of options available once they have completed their Sixth Form study. Students can attend the UCAS conference at Manchester University and the National Apprenticeship Event in Birmingham. Further information is provided in school during apprenticeship and UCAS information evenings. Many students take advantage of enrichment time on Wednesday afternoon to gain work experience and all students complete a week of work experience at the end of the year.

Employers also engage with students in Year 12 by running mock interviews, alongside our annual 2-day enterprise event. Students further develop careers skills through PSCHEE, looking at how to complete covering letters, apply for part-time work and complete a CV. A careers adviser from C&K Careers is available throughout the year. Presentations take place on student finance, interview skills, gap year opportunities and apprenticeship selection processes delivered by ex-students on placements.

There are lots of extra-curricular activities that allow students to develop their careers and enterprise knowledge and skills throughout the Sixth Form. These include Young Enterprise, debating, the Bar Mock Trial Competition and MedSoc.



EPQ (Extended Project Qualification)

This additional qualification allows well-motivated students to carry out their own research project in an area of their choice.

The EPQ was introduced nationally to give students an opportunity to pursue their own study interests beyond the constraints of their A-level subjects. Submitting a project for the EPQ will help to develop research and writing skills and will give participating students an advantage when it comes to undergraduate study at university.

Such research is aimed at developing skills which can be transferred throughout many subjects. It also demonstrates to universities and employers, students' ability to think independently and their real passion for their chosen subjects.

What does an EPO entail?

- Selecting a topic of interest and drafting a proposal for it.
- Planning, researching and carrying out the project.
- Providing evidence of all stages of the project.
- Delivering a presentation to a specified audience this can be in any format such as a play, a film, a piece of art or another original idea.

The EPQ really is an independent project which the student has control over, both in terms of their choice of research topic, and the form in which they present their findings.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

NHGS Sixth Form Entry Requirements

- A minimum of 6 GCSE subjects at Grade 5 or above including English and Mathematics.
- A Grade 5 or above in any subject to be studied at A-level (where the student has previously studied the subject).
- Equivalent vocational qualifications may be accepted.
- All full course, Level 2 qualifications, including Applied GCSEs, of whatever size will count as one GCSE.
- To study Biology, Physics or Chemistry, students need to have achieved a Grade 6 or above in the respective GCSEs or a minimum of two Grade 6s in Science and Additional Science at GCSE.
- To study Mathematics, Physics or Chemistry, students must have Grade 6 or above in Mathematics at GCSE.
- To study French or Spanish, students must have a Grade 6 or above in their chosen language.
- Students wanting to study 4 A level courses should achieve at least an average GCSE Grade of 7.
