A Level Religious Studies involves the study of three disciplines: Philosophy, Ethics and Buddhism. The jump from GCSE to A Level is considerable and the following transition tasks are designed to make the transition easier.

Expected Transition work (to be reviewed in the first 2 weeks of the course)

Ethics

TASK: Create a detailed glossary of the following terms; deontological, consequential, meta ethics, utilitarianism, teleological, sanctity of life, quality of life, corporate social responsibility, greenwashing, whistleblowing

Research Task: Research the issue of euthanasia, looking at the legal and moral issues raised.

- The UK Government has voted in favour of a review of assisted dying in the UK. Using the BBC website or similar trusted sources, research some of the details of this bill and some of the arguments in favour and against it. <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/topics/cljev4r3zgxt</u>
- Write an 800 word (approx) essay "The introduction of the assisted dying bill in the UK is not in the best interests of society." Evaluate this statement

Your essay must include: Your viewpoint on why euthanasia is moral or immoral and why you believe it, statistics and real life example cases to support your ideas and the benefits you believe keeping euthanasia illegal/legal would have for the future.



Key terms to include:

- sanctity of life
- quality of life
- voluntary euthanasia
- non-voluntary euthanasia
