## **Instrumental Music Tuition Terms and Conditions**

## **Contracts**

A contract will be made with the parent at the start of each academic year that your child receives instrumental tuition. This contract will contain the dates for payment of lessons and for giving notice should your child wish to stop receiving lessons.

New contracts will be sent to parents at the end of one academic year in time to start the new one.

#### **Fees**

Fees are payable termly in advance.

All lessons will be charged at the following rates. This guarantees the student an individual lesson every week, wherever possible.

The fee **per year** is £390. This can be paid termly (3 x £130)

ParentPay will be set up to enable parents to pay the amount either per term or for the whole year. The system also gives you the option of splitting this into smaller payments but please note that the full termly fee must be paid by the deadline stated on the contract. A reminder of the deadline will be emailed to you.

#### **Notice**

A student may only withdraw from lessons at the end of a term. An email or letter giving notice of intention to withdraw must be sent to the Music Lesson Co-ordinator before the half term break. (p.cain@nhgs.co.uk). Exact dates of this are published on the contract which is issued at the start of the academic year. If notice is not received by the published date the next term's full payment will still be due.

### **Number of Lessons**

Fees are calculated on the provision of a minimum of 30 lessons during the whole school year from September to July. Many students might find that they actually receive one or two lessons more than the minimum number over the year.

If the total falls below this number because of a teacher's absence, a credit will be given at the beginning of the next school year (i.e. September).

## **Group Sizes**

Students will receive an individual lesson.

## **Lesson Times**

The duration of an instrumental lesson will be 20 minutes. Wherever possible lessons will be timetabled during the normal school day.

Students will be excused from their normal school lesson for the duration of their instrumental lesson.

Sixth form students will be timetabled in their free periods.

Where break time, lunch time and after school times are available, priority will be given to Sixth Form and Year 11 students.

The timetable is organised on a rota system so that a student does not miss the same part of the same subject lesson each week. If it seems a child may miss the same lesson more than twice within the same half term, parents should communicate this concern to the Head of Music by email.

Students are responsible for being aware of the time of their lesson for checking the timetable regularly. Students are encouraged to write their lesson times in their planners at the start of each half term.

## **Availability**

It may be that lessons are not immediately available when an application is submitted. In this case, a waiting list will be drawn up and parents will be notified by email, by the Head of Music when tuition becomes available. Students may begin to receive instrumental lessons at any point in the academic year – subject to availability.

#### **Ensembles**

The school offers a variety of opportunities to perform as part of ensemble. **These are provided at no extra cost to the students at NHGS.** 

Performing in orchestras, bands and choirs is not only one of the most enjoyable parts of learning to play an instrument, but also very beneficial in terms of the student's general musicianship, intonation and aural training.

Students are expected and encouraged to join an ensemble to support their instrumental learning. Students will be approached by their instrumental teacher and/or the Head of Music inviting them to join an ensemble. Should a student have an interest in joining an ensemble then they are encouraged to enquire via their instrumental teacher and/or a member of the music department. All musicians in the school are encouraged to join a school vocal ensemble also.

#### Instruments

The school owns a limited number of instruments and, when available, these will be loaned to students. If an instrument is loaned through school, we require a small loan fee of £10 per year. This amount will help us to cover any maintenance costs that our instruments may incur. Wherever possible, we would recommend that parents purchase instruments for the use of their children. Instrumental teachers can advise on the purchase of suitable instruments. Please note that we do not have any guitars available on loan.

Students are expected to take their instruments home at the end of each school day. The school cannot accept responsibility for any instrument left in the school over a long period of time. Parents are advised to ensure that their household contents insurance policy covers the instrument (including instruments on loan from school).

### **Practice**

Playing a musical instrument is a very enjoyable and rewarding activity, but no child should apply to learn unless he or she is prepared to devote time to regular, meaningful practice. Meaningful practice constitutes <u>at least</u> 20 minutes of practice.

Parents are encouraged to help students, particularly of a younger age to organise this.

All students are provided with a practice diary where weekly tasks will be recorded by their instrumental teacher.

### Monitoring

Parents will regularly be kept up to date with their child's progress through the school monitoring system. ## **Google Classroom**

At the start of the academic year, each student will be invited to join a Google classroom for their specific instrumental teacher. This allows staff to communicate with individuals regarding lessons. Music lesson timetables are also posted on these classrooms so that students can access them from their own device. It is also possible for parents to view some of the information that is posted on here.
