 Young people are more likely to be successful in their job hunt if they have done some good work experience.

Over half of the graduate recruiters that took part in a recent research study by Highfliers said that, "graduates who have had no previous work experience at all are unlikely to be successful during the selection process and have little or no chance of receiving a job offer for their organisations' graduate programmes."

 If you haven't got a clue what career you want to do, work experience is a perfect way to sample all the career options out there.

It's a way of exploring different jobs without actually committing to anything. You can dip your toe in the water without taking the full plunge.



- It's the best way to get a real sense of your chosen industry. You'll get to speak to employees and ask them questions. You won't know what it's like until you get closer to the action.
- Doing work experience shows passion and interest. Evidence that you have done work experience shows the employer that you are motivated to get into a chosen career and that you've done your homework.
- If you're undecided about your career path, work experience might just be encouragement you need.
- If you do a variety of different work placements, you might find something you are passionate about and get motivated.

- Work experience gently introduces you to the world of work.
- You get to learn the do's and don'ts, get work place savvy and learn to navigate your way through the jungle of office politics.
- Vitally, it'll give you an idea of the skills you might need to thrive in the workplace.
- It'll help you identify your own skills and perhaps even highlight the areas that you might want to work on and give you a good understanding of your strengths and weakness.

- You might wow them so much that you'll be offered a job!
- It's all about networking. It'll help you build up contacts and, you
 might even get a heads up about a future job or be
 recommended to another company.
- And yes, work experience does give you something to put on your CV!



Students start to think about what sort of career they would like to experience.


Use the Previous Placement suggestions, These placements have accepted students in the past from NHGS.


Step Two:

Re: Year 11 Career Development Placement Application (formerly known as Work Experience)

At North Halifax Grammar School Year 10 students are preparing to embark on their Career Development Placement which will take place in the summer term of Year 10. This experience is planned as an integral part of their careers education. If you have accepted one of our students for a Career Development Placement in the past we would like to thank you for your support, you will notice that the dates for Work Experience at NHGS have changed for 2024 as we have made the decision to move the experience into the summer term of Year 10. Students find Career Development Placements a valuable opportunity and in most cases, placements report that having one of our students for a week has been beneficial to their organisation.

This year's placements will take place for one week between Monday 8th July to Friday 12th July. In order to make the experience as realistic as possible, we have asked the students to try to arrange their own Career Development Placements. They have been asked to identify organisations which might provide an interesting placement for them and submit their CV and

The placement is intended to help students develop a greater appreciation of employment issues and the world of work, while at the same time providing an opportunity to build self-confidence and take personal responsibility for their actions.

As employers we ask you to:

- · Arrange a mutually convenient time with the student to carry out a pre placement interview
- Provide a brief description of daily tasks and duties
- Go through health and safety procedures with the student on their first day of placement
- . Complete the google form link here: Placement Acceptance Form confirming your acceptance of the placement please complete as soon as possible, you will be asked to upload a copy of your Employer Liability Insurance certificate as part of the form, please take a photo of this and upload this for our records.
- Complete and return a placement feedback form once the student has completed their week at their Career Development Placement, this may be in the form of a telephone interview and Google Form.
- Inform the school of any absence / non attendance this is very important

Students are asked to keep a diary as a record of the placement and time will be allocated to evaluate outcomes on their return

Placements are organised under the supervision of Xperience https://bradfordskills.co.uk/xperience/ . If you are not already on their main database of employers they may contact you to ascertain if you would be willing to be included on their database in the future. They may also contact you to ensure that adequate health and safety provision is in place and appropriate certificates


We have very high standards and we expect the highest standards of behaviour from our students. We trust the week will be a positive experience for everyone concerned.

Use Morrisby on 9/1 and 16/1

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
Safeguarding Students on their Career Development Experience

Placements should not be arranged with Sole Traders as they do not have Employers Liability Insurance to safeguard students whilst on Career Development Experience.

Step Four:

Deadline Friday 23rd February


All completed and signed application forms must be returned to Mrs Manley or Mrs Beal in the school office.



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Step Five:

The placement should return the Placement Acceptance form to school within 1 week. You may be asked to chase this if it is not returned.



Step Six:

Deadline for all information to be sent to Xperience 8th March

Xperience will then carry out health and safety risk assessments for ALL placements.



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Career Development Experience at NHGS – Schedule

June-July: Job descriptions to be issued to students

All students to make contact with employers to confirm final arrangements by telephone and check the placement is still available. This gives you time to find an alternative if needed.

8th-12th July: Career Development Experience placements.

Students complete their Career Development Experience booklets and collect a range of evidence about what they have done.

Career Development Placement Application – A Step by Step Guide

Detailed below is the step by step guide to applying for your Career Development Placement. If at any time you require help or advice, please speak to Mrs Manley or Mrs Beal in the school office.

You should tick each step as you complete it. You will then be able to keep up to date with the progress of your application.

Step 1

Have a look at the materials shared with you on the Careers Google Classroom. If you have not already joined, here is the link: Year 10 Careers Classroom

Step 2

Decide what area of employment you would like to work in i.e. law, banking, construction, leisure, medicine, etc. and then decide which company/companies you want to apply for a placement with. The booklet we have shared with you will be a good starting point.

Step 3

If you experience difficulty in finding your own placement and would like some help, please speak to Mrs Manley or Mrs Beal in the school office as soon as possible. We can then give you some advice. You should then follow steps 4 to 6.

Step 4

Make a phone call to the company to find out if they accept students for placements and if they have availability for the dates you need. This will save a lot of time waiting for them to reply to your letter. We have produced a flow chart to help you.

Step 5

Write to the company of your choice by sending a CV and covering letter, you can send this by email. Have a look at the sample CV in the Career Development section on the school website to get an idea as to what your CV should look like and what information it should contain.

You must also send the 'Letter to Employer' and 'Placement Acceptance Form' from school with your application for a placement. These can be sent via email too.

Make a follow up phone call if you do not hear anything within 2 weeks.

Step 6

When the employer confirms that they are happy to take you on, complete your Career Development Placement Application (Google) Form and ask a parent or carer to log onto ParentPay and give consent for you to attend by **Monday** 5th **June**.

Step 7

In September 2023, you must contact your employer to confirm final arrangements. This is very important as employers' situations can change over the months of arranging a placement. If the placement is likely to fall through it is better to find out sooner rather than later.

Step 8

Enjoy your Career Development Placement!!!




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


